


June 12 = "Hymn Sing Sunday"

In the name of God, the leaders and members of a faith community grow in their individual journeys of faith, and they strengthen one another in the community's journey of faith.

Coffee Hour After Church Meet 'n Greet

These three phrases describe what our faith community calls Time of Fellowship. It is that "sacred time," after our Sunday service, when church folk gather to "be the church" with food and fellowship.

Sharing the Fellowship is the opportunity for church members and friends to "be the church" and to provide simple refreshments for our Time of Fellowship.

How may you participate in Sharing the Fellowship?

- 1. On a Sunday morning, arrive at Fellowship Hall by 9:45 a.m.
- 2. Bring: 2 dozen edible treats (example: cookies, muffins, sweet rolls or fruit)

Half gallon of fruit juice (Apple or mixed berry is most popular.)

Quart of Half & Half (for coffee and tea)

- 3. If necessary, slice edible treats into individual servings. Cover them with foil or plastic wrap.
- 4. Place food items that require refrigeration into the Church Refrigerator.
- 5. Assist the Deacon-of-the-Day with setting out:

Coffee cups Napkins Condiments

Drink cups Paper plates Pitcher for Half & Half cream

NOTE: All paper goods and condiments are provided by our church.

- 6. Before singing of final hymn, come downstairs to Fellowship Hall to:
 - a. Turn off coffee pot
 - b. Pour out fruit juice and Half & Half cream
 - c. Place treats on table.

Coffee Cereal (Rice Krispies and Cheerios)

Peanut Butter Toothpaste (4 oz. and larger)

Toothbrushes (two-pack)

Church members and friends may bring contributions for our Sharing-the-Light Food Collection on the first Sunday of each month. As well, a basket—marked "Grafton Food Bank Donations"--rests prominently on the counter of our Church Kitchen and receives food items seven days a week.

Monthly, Rev. Barbara transports the food and non-perishable goods to the Grafton Food Bank, housed in the Grafton Municipal Center.
