Dear friends and members of our Congregational Church of Grafton:

Lists. Those series of words or names or items—written or printed or imagined—that feature one after another after another...of whatever is being listed.

Lists. They may organize us, inspire us, remind us, dare us, annoy us, frustrate us, and haunt us.

Lists. Ultimately our lists define who we are. The lists that we maintain—on our phones, in our computers, on random pieces of paper—identify who is important to us and what is essential to us.

Think about it: Who was on your Christmas gift list? What is on your "bucket list" of activities to do before your expiration date? Who is on your to-call-in-the-event-of-emergency list?

In 1977, David Wallenchinsky published the first of several best-selling *Book of Lists*. Each of his *Book of Lists* contains hundreds of lists of unique, obscure and outright bizarre topics. The first edition of Wallenchinsky's book lists:

1. Most dangerous places in the world to hitchhike

- 2. Ten worst song titles of all time
- 3. Breeds of dogs that bite people the most...and that bite people the least

In Holy Scripture, the Old Testament records hundreds of lists: of God-issued Commandments; of purification rites; of sacrificial specifications. In the New Testament, Jesus of Nazareth tells more stories than he declares lists. In his epistles, the Apostle Paul is prone to iterate lists, as with his list of the fruits of the spirit: *Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.* (Galatians 5:22-23)

In the New Year, some may make a list of New Year resolutions of how they aspire to live differently in the New Year. Most, however, do not undertake such a personal mission.

Even so, may you consider this list of "A Dozen To-Do's for the New Year":

- 1. To accept gifts and appreciate them
- 2. To give gifts and forget that you gave them
- 3. To thank God for sharing miracles with you
- 4. To choose to feel joy-whether in smile, a sunrise or a rainbow
- 5. To listen and to tell
- 6. To laugh heartily and to weep deeply
- 7. To think and to ponder
- 8. To study and to improve
- 9. To initiate and to change
- 10. To stand up after being pushed down
- 11. To learn when to walk in and when to walk away
- 12. To be fearless

A lofty list? Perhaps. A plausible list? Definitely. Select one or two from the list. Or six. Or even all twelve. Print off this list. Keep it handy—in your phone, on a refrigerator, or in a Bible you read daily. Some cannot live <u>with</u> a list. Some cannot live <u>without</u> a list. May you live <u>by</u> this list. A new list for the New Year.

Message: Now I Lay Me down to Sleep


