Dear members and friends of our Congregational Church of Grafton:

Questions and answers. Questions or answers. Questions versus answers.

Throughout the history of human thought, the dichotomy between questions and answers has provoked considerable debate. The Greek philosopher Plato proclaimed:

The right question is usually more important than the right answer.

The American poet and novelist Nancy Willard claimed:

Sometimes questions are more important than answers.

Even Jesus of Nazareth is recalled more vividly for his questions than his answers:

What do you want me to do for you? (Mark 10:51) Which one was neighbor to the one attacked by robbers? (Luke 10:36)

Who do you say that I am? (Matthew 16:15)

The month of August straddles the season of summer, marked by travels and vacations, and the season of autumn, marked by new academic beginnings and old programmatic restarts.

This month of August is particularly rapt with post-pandemic, mid-nostalgic wonderings for faith communities. Throughout the globe, the faith industry faces more unknowns than knowns. Thus, the bright and bold mission for faith leaders is to listen—intentionally, scripturally and prayerfully—for the questions that our God may want us to ask.

If we are asking: How do we rebuild our Christian Education Program?

Perhaps God would have us ask: What kind of support do students at nearby schools need?

If we are asking: Why aren't more people attending worship?

Perhaps God would have us ask: Where are people gathering for support and community, and how may we join them?

If we are asking: What does our congregation think we should do? Perhaps God would have us ask: What do our neighbors need?

If we are asking: Why can't we do this program anymore?

Perhaps God would have us ask: Has this program completed its life-cycle? What may we do instead?

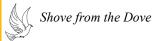
If we are asking: How do we get back to what we were doing before?

Perhaps God would have us ask: What is God inviting us to do for the future?

The Austrian-American business consultant Peter Drucker cautioned:

The most serious mistakes are not being made as a result of wrong answers. The greatest danger is asking the wrong questions.

This season, as a family of faith, let's be about the work of asking divinely inspired questions.

Likewise, we gather together for the Feast for All (aka Communion).

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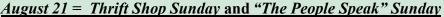


Scripture focus: Before Abraham was born, I am. (John 8:58)

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"I Am" Statements of Jesus: New Sermon Series on Sundays

Question: How do you describe Jesus of Nazareth?

Perhaps your answer may reflect the reply to this question: *How does Jesus describe <u>himself</u>*?

The Gospel of John records seven distinct "I Am" statements issued by Jesus:

I am the bread of life – John 6:35
Before Abraham was, I am – John 8:58
I am the good shepherd – John 10:11
I am the Light of the world – John 8:12
I am the vine; you are the branches – John 15:5
I am the resurrection – John 11:25
I am the way, the truth and the life – John 14:6

During the past two and a half years, our faith community has engaged in four scripture-based sermon series on:

Psalms Parables of Jesus The Beatitudes "Better...Than" Proverbs

During the months of August, September and October, join our family of faith on Sunday mornings—in-person or online—as we study and reflect on the "I Am" statements of Jesus of Nazareth.

Mission Outreach Committee Updates

The Mission Outreach Committee (MOC) has been making tremendous efforts to serve the community of Grafton and other surrounding communities by continuing to support the following initiatives:

- 1. Donating food items on the "Sharing the Light" Sundays (food items donated to the Grafton Food Bank).
- 2. Ongoing service at Worcester Fellowship by serving at the "Thursday Café." (Contact Barbara Gow at 301-580-0628 if you would like to serve at Thursday Café).
- 3. "Adopt-a-Family" initiative This is an initiative of the MOC, where the MOC will identify a family each month to help them with current needs by assisting the families with a gift card valued at \$100. The MOC has identified six families who will benefit from this initiative. Three of the recipients are from the Grafton Senior Citizens community and the other three are single-parent families in Worcester.
- 4. "Operation Backpack" is back! Let's continue to support this initiative by putting smiles on the faces of the future: the children. Let's help them to prepare for a new school year. The MOC is now seeking donations of back-to-school supplies to fill at least 30 backpacks. We already have a sufficient number of backpacks to be filled.
