Dear members and friends of our Congregational Church of Grafton:

What is your favorite season?

From a scientific view, the astronomical seasons are based on the position of the Earth relative to the sun. The meteorological seasons are based on annual temperature cycles.

From an aesthetic view, the seasons of nature—Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter—are visibly discernible in the foliage of trees that proliferate throughout our New England landscape.

Spring brings on buds and leaf sprouts.

Summer enlarges leaf sizes and deepens leaf hues.

Autumn alters leaf colors and frees leaves to dance at the wind's whim.

Winter bares tree branches of leaves in sync with the mystical rhythm of tree sap.

From a spiritual view, the seasons of life—birth and death; grief and mirth; war and peace—are consistently accompanied by seismic changes that transform the human mind, body and soul.

Poets have put words to the seasons of humankind:

Spring passes, and one remembers one's innocence. Summer passes, and one remembers one's exuberance. Autumn passes, and one remembers one's reverence. Winter passes, and one remembers one's perseverance. (Yoko Ono)



Wisdom literature in Holy Scripture has recorded sixteen contrasting seasons of the soul, beginning with the words:

For everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven. (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

Beginning in late April and continuing through early September, our faith community engages in a soulful journey through distinct, yet universal, seasons of the human spirit, as noted in the Book of Ecclesiastes, Chapter 3:1-8.

On Sunday mornings in May, we will consider the nature and nuances of these seasons: May 7 – Healing Sunday: A time to kill; and a time to heal May 14 – Motherhood Sunday: A time to break down; and a time to build up May 21 – Holy Humor Sunday: A time to weep; and a time to laugh

On Sunday mornings, from now until September, you are tenderly invited to join in a reflective, scriptural and prayerful journey through seasons of the spirit and the times of life. Our journey through the sacred verses of *Ephesians 3* may surely evoke personal change, transformation and spiritual growth.
