Dear members and friends of our Congregational Church of Grafton:

June is bustin' out all over! The opening lyrics of the song from the Rodgers and Hammerstein musical, *Carousel*, aptly describe our current month in contrast with our three precious months:

March went out like a lion-A whippin' up the water in the bay.
Then April cried and stepped aside;
And along come pretty little May!
May was full of promises,
But she didn't keep 'em quickly enough for some.

A mere four weeks ago, our seasonal landscape featured still-bare tree branches, punctuated with tentative buds. Likewise, night-time temperatures dipped frequently to sub-freezing numbers.

Now, in June, which boasts two seasons in its 30-day stretch (Spring from June 1 to June 21, the Summer Solstice), our New England landscape is bursting with vivid foliage on trees of every genus. Moreover, our "RealFeel" lows will likely not drop to the 30s until late September.

Ah! The vibrant and tangible distinctions in our seasons of nature!

And, like the seasons of the year, our human lives change frequently and drastically. We may enjoy these seasons or endure these seasons, as they come and go, as they ebb and flow.

In the Old Testament, Wisdom Literature names sixteen distinct seasons of the human spirit:

For everything there is a season, and
a time for every purpose under heaven. (Ecclesiastes 3:1)



As we began in late April and as we will continue through early September, our family of faith studies and reflects on the "seasons of the soul" recorded in the Book of Ecclesiastes, Chapter 3:1-8.

On Sunday mornings in June, we will engage in the simplicity and complexity of these seasons:

June 4 – Mourning Dance Sunday: A time to mourn; and a time to dance

June 11 - Give-a-Hug Sunday: A time to embrace; and a time to refrain from embracing

June 25 - Graduation Sunday: A time to seek; and a time to lose

From now until September 3, join our faith community on Sunday mornings for a studious and contemplative journey through "seasons of the soul" and times of human life. Our reflective journey through selective verses of *Ephesians 3* may inspire spiritual change, growth and transformation.
