Dear friends and members of our Congregational Church of Grafton:

The first prayer you ever learned to say aloud? Can you recall that prayer? May it have been a bedtime prayer?

Now I lay me down to sleep.

I pray the Lord my soul to keep....

When pressed for an answer to "What's the first prayer you prayed?", many church-raised children-now-adults may reply "the Lord's Prayer" or "the Our Father."

On Sunday mornings, within our Congregational Church of Grafton, we pray aloud the Lord's Prayer at the end of our Prayers of the People—near the conclusion of our time of faith-sharing. In this liturgical position, the Lord's Prayer serves as an emphatic exclamation point to the words of praise, of gratitude and of supplication that are offered prior to the words "Our Father, who art in heaven...."

In our habitual and often mechanical recitation of the Lord's Prayer, the meanings of the words and the origins of the images in the prayer may be blurred, overlooked or unquestioned.

Time for a change. No more mindless mumbling of the Lord's Prayer in our sacred space!

Beginning on Homecoming Sunday, September 10, and extending to the fourth Sunday of Advent, December 24, we will journey through meanings of the historic words and origins of the multi-layered images of the Lord's Prayer. Our new Bible Study/Sermon Series may draw us deeper into the spiritual practice called "prayer" and into the theological roots of this commonly spoken prayer.

The Contemporary English Version (CEV) offers this translation of the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father in heaven, help us to honor your name.

Come and set up your kingdom, so that everyone on earth will obey you,
as you are obeyed in heaven.
Give us our food for today.

Forgive us for doing wrong, as we forgive others.
Keep us from being tempted and protect us from evil.

Our nine-sermon series will focus on this traditional translation of the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.

Thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

## **Coming This Fall - Discussion Groups!**

The WOW Factor Committee is excited to offer opportunities for families and friends of our church to get together in discussion groups centered around topics of interest in our world today. We will begin in October with three topics that were mentioned several times in the focus group last spring: mental health, the environmental crisis, and prayer. #### **Mental Health**

The NYT #1 best seller, *Atomic Habits* by James Clear, has been chosen to start the discussion about mental health issues. This book offers strategies for forming good habits and breaking bad ones. Small changes in our behaviors can lead to remarkable changes in our personal and spiritual lives. Join with others interested in making positive changes in their lives.

## **Becoming a Praying Church**

To enhance our journey to become a praying church, we will look at the book *Learning to Pray:* a *Guide for Everyone* by James Martin, SJ. This book was written for anyone wanting to know more about prayer--from atheists to professional church leaders. Topics that will be discussed include: What is prayer; How to pray; and What to expect when we pray. We are all individuals with unique styles for praying - come explore some new ideas.

#### **Environment**

Many people expressed an interest in environmental issues--certainly one of the hot topics in our world today. This group discussion will center around the book *Cathedral on Fire* by Brooks Berndt. We will explore the questions: Why should we care? What can we, as individuals, do? What can we, as a church, do?
