Dear members and friends of our Congregational Church of Grafton:

Have you ever considered the place, the presence and the power of choice? Life is about choices.

Some we applaud.

Some we attribute to naivete.

Some we allow to haunt us forever.

A viable lesson? We are what we choose to be.

The month of February presents us with a quirky holiday about choices: Groundhog Day.

On February 2, when Groundhog Day is observed in the United States and Canada, a groundhog—emerging from hibernation—faces two choices. According to tradition, if a groundhog sees its shadow due to clear weather, then the rodent will retreat to its burrow. Winter will persist for six more weeks. If, however, the groundhog sees no shadow due to cloudy weather, then the rodent will linger outside its den. Spring will arrive early.

Studies have found no consistent correlation between a groundhog seeing its shadow and the subsequent arrival of springlike weather. Moreover, in the northern hemisphere, the spring (or vernal) equinox occurs around March 21, when the sun moves north across the celestial equator. The number of days between February 2, 2022 and March 20, 2022 (March 20 marks the first day of Spring this year) measures six weeks and three days—regardless of the groundhog's shadow sighting.

Even so, Groundhog Day gives us humans a choice: to feel glum-like winter or glee-like spring.

May we consider these words first penned by columnist/humorist Dorothy Wilhelm:

Here's the thing: In every life crisis, there's that moment when you must choose whether to trade down to despair, or up to joy. I will choose joy. From now on, with whatever I've got left, I'll look for occasions of laughter. I'll blow soap bubbles. I'll make snow angels. I'll run barefoot on the beach. Maybe I'll even dye my hair red! When I speak, I will smile. I will see that there is laughter in my voice. Everyday. As long as I have, as long as it matters, I will choose joy.
