Dear members and friends of our Congregational Church of Grafton:

I'm only wishing to go a-fishing; For this the month of May was made.

Our new month of May seems to be "made" for many traditional holidays and for a generous assortment of non-traditional events. Traditionally, May is the month when we honor:

Cinco de Mayo – May 5 Mother's Day – May 9 Armed Forces Day – May 15 Memorial Day – May 31

More whimsically, May is also the month when we acknowledge:

World Laughter Day – May 2 [We celebrate "Holy Humor Sunday" on that day!]
International No Diet Day – May 6 [Do we hear cheers?]
National No Dirty Dishes Day – May 18 [Do we hear even more cheers?]
Learn about Composting Day – May 29 [Do we hear the Earth cheer?]

Nestled in between these days that call attention to lofty and lively themes is this more subdued day: National Memo Day – May 21

And the memo of the day is a mere two-word message: Words matter.

Words—particularly written words—may be wielded as a tool or a weapon. Written words, because of their indelible permanency, serve as a conduit of kindness and as a language of creativity. As well, written words may serve as an agent of cruelty and as a perpetrator of violence.

In our e-culture that is saturated with emails and social media, may we be especially mindful of the "blessings and curses" that emanate from the words we write. To implement the philosophy that "Words matter," may we print out the following acronym--**THINK**--for our personal reference and application:

T...Is it TRUE? Or is it a fabrication or a distortion, like a fun house mirror, with no fun intended?
H...Is it HELPFUL? Will it clear the air? Or will it pollute the air?
I...Is it INSPIRING? Will it make Angels sing? Or will the Devil dance? And will Logic weep?
N...Is it NECESSARY that this story be told? Will the world be a better place? Or a worse place?
K...Is is KIND? This one element alone may determine the decision to write or the choice to delete.

Our faith community is a "Safe Church"--made safe by the enforcement of written policies and, more especially, by the enforcement of "safe" words.

Words matter. Use them with care. Everywhere.
