What happened next filled with belief those who had felt doubt.


No one in that room could explain, for all eyes had been closed, but there on the desk beside her lay one long-stemmed pink rose.

During the month of May, members of our church's *F.A.C.E. Group* (<u>Faith And Caring Encounter Group</u>) performed in a variety of creative venues—all the while making a profound difference in the lives of their audiences and in their own lives.

In Grafton High School Theatre's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, **Sophie Coldwell** shined in her pivotal role as Quince. Sophie's poise and effervescence sparkled throughout the production that was based on a play originally written by William Shakespeare.

In the same Shakespearean production, **Abby Hise** performed convincingly and entertainingly in her relatable role of The Dreamer. Abby's sense of wonder and her sense of self-confidence were visible—even from behind her on-stage mask.

In The Dance Place Studio's dance recital, titled "The Show Goes On," **Maggie McLean** performed in seven dance numbers with impressive agility and athleticism. Maggie's wide range of dance skills includes: tap, hip-hop, modern, lyrical, ballet and point.

For participants in both the theatrical and dance productions, these events were the first indoor, in-person performances that the actors and dancers presented to a seated audience since the dawn of COVID-19 in March 2020. For the artists and the audience alike, the performances were poignant testimonies to the resilience and creativity of youth—in all seasons.

Update from the Onward and Forward Team

News is breaking fast on the COVID front! Quick new bytes tell us that the CDC says vaccinated people no longer need masks and that the State of Massachusetts is lifting mandates on May 29. What does this mean for the Congregational Church of Grafton and for each of us individually? These are the questions being studied by the Onward and Forward Team.

The O & F Team considers information and guidance from several different sources: the CDC, the Commonwealth of MA and the Southern New England Conference of the UCC, to name a few. We then consider the impact of these data sources on who we are as a church and what we want to do. We then present our findings to Cabinet and the congregation. Look for our next report in early June.

One important point to always remember: The CDC makes best-practice recommendations for the whole country. The State makes recommendations for the State of Massachusetts. The O & F Team can make recommendations for the Congregational Church of Grafton. It is up to each of us, individually, to make informed and wise decisions for ourselves and those who are close to us.

May the Spirit of Love and Respect guide our choices.
