Dear friends and members of our Congregational Church of Grafton:

In this month of April, when gardens yearn to resurrect to new life, may the garden of your souls be nourished by this story: Mid-morning of one Spring day, a newly ordained clergywoman strolled through the public rose garden of her Midwestern town. She was accompanied by another woman minister, who had served in churches for 30 years and who was mentor to the novice minister.

The new minister had worked in her first church for only one month. She sighed aloud, "I want to honor my ordination vows and to serve God with all my heart, mind and spirit. How do I know how God wants to use me in my new church and with my new congregation?"

The veteran minister smiled at her younger clergy counterpart and replied, "That's a thoughtful question. Let's take a closer look at the roses."

On the slip of paper was this poem:

The secret of unfolding rosebuds is not known to such as I. God opens rosebuds gently, but, in my hands, they die.



Confirmation Sunday Celebrates F.A.C.E. Group's Four-Month Journey

In the context of active faith and caring, six young people of our congregation examined their faith, engaged in two caring service projects and observed the faith traditions of five different religious communities during the faith-formation program called *F.A.C.E.* (Faith And Caring Encounter) Group.

These six young people are:

The two service projects were:

Christmas Wish List for the residents of the Crescent Manor Adult Care Facility Souper Bowl Canned Soup Drive to benefit the Grafton Food Bank

The five different worshiping venues that the young people experienced included:Caribbean PentecostalismSouth African EvangelicalismMennonite (Anabaptist Christianity)Conservative JudaismUnitarian UniversalismConservative Judaism

Moreover, the young people participated in multiple worship opportunities within our church's New England-style of Congregationalism:

Advent Wreath Candle-lighting tradition Christmas Eve Candle lighting tradition Preparation of Communion elements and serving Holy Communion Special sound effects for a Spiritual Storm Dramatic Interpretation of a Parable Participation in the worship service on Confirmation Sunday

Rev. Barbara organized and facilitated the *F.A.C.E. Group* activities. She was assisted by family members of the participants.

The *F.A.C.E. Group* program began on the first Sunday of Advent, December 3, 2023. The four-month schedule of faithbased "Field Trips," of visits to community service centers and of on-site worship participation concluded with a Ceremony of Confirmation and a Confirmation Reception on Palm Sunday, March 24, 2024. On Palm Sunday/Confirmation Sunday, two young people were baptized for the first time while four other students affirmed their earlier Rites of Baptism.

By benefit of their spiritual journey of Confirmation, the six young people were joyfully welcomed into the membership of the Congregational Church of Grafton on March 24!

3. Look for our GoFundMe page and share it with all your friends!


4. **IMPORTANT!** Your pledges and donations are still important to reach our goal of \$50,000. Donations and pledges will be accepted through the end of the year.

Sharing the Light Shows Forth Kindness, Generosity and Faithfulness

The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. (Galatians 5:22-23)

In the liturgical season called Eastertide (the 50 days after Easter), our church continues its scriptural study of the nine fruits of the Spirit, as noted in Paul's Epistle to the Galatians.

During the first three Sundays in the month of April, the Bible Study/Sermons specifically focus on these three fruits of the Spirit: Kindness, Generosity and Faithfulness.

Members and friends of the Congregational Church of Grafton are encouraged to show forth these fruits of the Spirit by donating non-perishable goods to the Grafton Food Bank. To address food insecurity in our local community, the Grafton Food Bank asks for these "Wish List" items:

> Canned fruit & vegetables Canned beans Canned tuna (in water) Pasta & pasta sauce

Cereal (Rice Krispies, Cheerios, Oatmeal) Ground coffee & tea bags Peanut Butter & jelly Pancake mix & syrup

Every first Sunday morning of the month, these donations may be brought forward for the Sharing-the-Light Food Collection. During weekdays, a "Sharing-the-Light" Food Basket in Fellowship Hall accepts these donations. Throughout each month, all donations are regularly delivered to the Grafton Food Bank.



Showing forth kindness, generosity, and faithfulness to those who experience food insecurity is a fruitful way to share God's Light.
