Alongside

Jesus told this parable: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other, for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted." - Luke 18:9-14 excerpted (NRSV)

This parable's moral seems delightfully clear: Exalt yourself, get humbled. Humble yourself, get exalted.

So, if I just act like the tax collector - stay humble, keep my eyes down, don't pat myself on the back too much - I won't be like that other prideful, judgy guy, right?

Oops. There I go, trying to prove I'm the faithful one: still creating distance from others, still trying to land on the "right" side in the eyes of God.

But there's a footnote in *The Jewish Annotated New Testament* that opens this story up beautifully. Turns out, the Greek "rather than" could be translated "alongside." Imagine hearing Jesus say, "This man went home justified *alongside* the other." What a relief!

Because days of exaltation and days of humility come for all of us. Some days we pray like the Pharisee: "Thank God I'm not like them. Thank God I'm not ruled by fear or hate. Thank God I'm living my values." Other days we pray like the tax collector, eyes lowered as we whisper, "God, be merciful to me, I really messed up." Both prayers belong on the path of faith. Either way, we are justified. Either way, we are loved.

Prayer

Lord, you love me in my strength and my weakness. Give me the courage to walk in love and faith alongside my neighbors. Amen.

We invite you to contribute a Food Basket with non-perishable canned and boxed items needed for a family's Thanksgiving meal. In addition, we ask that the basket may include a Gift Card or Gift Certificate for the family to purchase a turkey. To ensure timely delivery before Thanksgiving Day, please deliver your basket to our church kitchen by noon on Sunday, November 23. These will be given to people in Worcester through Pernet Family Health Services.

Canned Vegetables
Canned Cranberry Sauce
Gravy Jar or Mix
Dry Mix for Rolls or Breads
Pudding or Pie Filling, etc.

If you would like to donate a gift card for a turkey without making up a basket, we invite you to drop it off at the church office in an envelope marked Thanksgiving Food Baskets. Gift cards can be from Stop & Shop, Price Chopper, Price Rite, Walmart, VISA or Mastercard.
