Our month of February brims with special holidays and Holy Days:

Groundhog Day – February 2
Valentine's Day – February 14
President's Day – February 20
Mardi Gras – February 21
Ash Wednesday – February 22

The Holy Day known as Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the liturgical season of Lent. During this 40-day season, from Ash Wednesday to sundown on Holy Thursday, the faithful are invited to engage in purposeful contemplation, in acts of kindness and in abstinence from luxuries—as a way to prepare spiritually for the event of the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

This year, as a Lenten scriptural study, our faith community will engage in a seven-week sermon series on Sunday mornings, based on the *Seven Last Words of Christ*:

- 1 Father, forgive them, for they don't know what they are doing. (Luke 23:34) February 19
- 2 Today you will be with me in paradise. (Luke 23:43) February 26
- 3 Woman, here is your son....Here is your mother. (John 19:26-27) March 5
- 4 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? (Matthew 27:46) March 12
- 5 I am thirsty. (John 19:28) March 19
- 6 It is finished. (John 19:30) March 26
- 7 Father, into your hands, I commend my spirit. (Luke 23:46) April 2

## Sharing-the-Light in February: "Souper Bowl" Canned Soup Drive Ongoing until Super Bowl Sunday, February 12

During 46 weeks of each calendar year, our congregation supports the local Grafton Food Bank by collecting these requested items:

Canned fruit Solid white tuna in water

Canned beans
Peanut Butter
Cereal (Rice Krispies and Cheerios)
Toothpaste (4 oz. and larger)

Coffee Toothbrushes (2-pack)

However, during the four weeks of January and the first two weeks February, our family of faith and all organizations who meet in our church facilities (Scouts, Twelve-Step groups and more) contribute to our yearly "Souper Bowl" Canned Soup Drive, which also supports the Grafton Food Bank.

Our 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Souper Bowl Canned Soup Drive, which began on January 8, will conclude on February 12.

Canned soup donations may be placed in the *Souper Bowl Canned Soup Basket* in our Church Kitchen during the first two weeks of February or on the *Souper Bowl Table* in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings.

Our goal for our Souper Bowl Canned Soup Drive is 570 cans of soup (for Super Bowl LVII).

#### Dear friends at the Congregational Church of Grafton, UCC:

Thank you for your donation of gifts this holiday season. With your help, we provided presents to 372 families for their children to open on Christmas morning, or for the children to receive an exciting surprise, if their family does not celebrate the holiday of Christmas.

The week before Christmas, we learned about a particular family in need. The mother was planning to cancel Christmas because she couldn't afford it. But her two young daughters, age 3 and 6, were looking forward to celebrating. The mother's words were: "I was just going to pretend we missed Christmas because I literally had nothing for them."

We quickly mobilized and put together toys and clothing for the mother and her daughters. One of our employees delivered the gifts just before Christmas.

The mother was overwhelmed with appreciation. After Christmas, she called our service office three times to thank us for our help.

At Pernet, this describes how we try to serve the community. Holidays may bring joy and excitement for some. But they may bring stress and pain for others.

We are grateful that these two young girls and more than a thousand other children were able to celebrate Christmas with a few gifts and also with being surrounded by people who love them.
